He won a \$10,000 prize for his book, "How to Get A Girl and Keep Her." Kay Smith tried for some time to get a job as a chorus girl, but


she found herself a husband who owns a swanky nightclub in Las Vagas. Jean Towler has become a famous scientist. She is still trying

To earn money for the March of Dimes, the generous male seniors played a fast, close and exciting basketball game with the male faculty members. We remain silent as to the score and victors.






At the time that this article was written we had not as yet taken our train ride to Washington D. C.. But our time is planned to the very last second.

O Commencement ! not the ending that is seems to all our strife, But the gate that opens outward to a bigger, broader life!


